

ORDINANCE NO. 1003

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WILLISTON AMENDING SECTION 10-299 OF THE WILLISTON CODE OF ORDINANCES TO AMEND THE PENALTY CLAUSE TO THE ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF WILLISTON, NORTH DAKOTA.

Sec. 10-299. Penalty.


The police department shall be responsible for enforcement of parking violations. Vehicles illegally parked shall be cited by the attachment of a notice to said vehicle which shall inform the owner or operator thereof that said vehicle has been parked illegally under one or more of these sections and instructing the owner or operator to report to the City of Williston Police Headquarters. Said notice shall also contain the following information:

- (a) Date and hour of violation;
- (b) Make of vehicle;
- (c) License number and state of issuance;
- (d) Location of place of violation; and
- (e) A description of the violation.

With the exception of violations of section 10-273, the penalty for violation of any of these sections shall be dollars (\$50.00). If not paid within thirty (30) days from the date of the violation, the penalty shall increase to one hundred dollars (\$100.00). The penalty for violation of section 10-273 shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00). If a summons is used to compel appearance for a violation of any of these sections, the general penalty provisions of the City of Williston, namely, a fine of up to one thousand dollars five hundred (\$1,500.00) a jail sentence of up to thirty (30) days, or both such fine and jail sentence, shall be applicable, at the discretion of the municipal judge.

Commissioner Bekkedahl moved the adoption of the foregoing Ordinance. The Motion was seconded by Commissioner Brostuen. On roll call vote of the Commissioners vote "AYE": Brostuen, Bekkedahl, Piesik, Cymbaluk and Klug; and the following Commissioners voted "NAY": None. Absent and not voting: None.

WHEREUPON, the Motion was passed and the Ordinance declared adopted this 9th day of September, 2014.
