
BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Williston, North Dakota, that the Resolution of Necessity for the improvement benefiting **AMENDED STREET & ALLEY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT 10-3 Section II—24<sup>th</sup> Avenue Northeast** has been published in accordance with law, providing for the determination of the sufficiency of the protests at the meeting of the Board of City Commissioners held this date, and it is determined that written protests have not been filed with the City Auditor by the owners of a majority of the area of property within the district, within 30 days from the first publication of the resolution, and the Board of City Commissioners is authorized by NDCC 40-22-18 to cause the improvement to be made and to contract or otherwise provide for the construction thereof and the acquisition of any property required in connection therewith, and to levy and collect special assessments therefore.
