- A. **Public Hearing** - Variance Request for Siting a Mobile Home Older Than 15 Years in the Agriculture Zoning District, Located at 5262 139th Avenue NW, Sublot 1 in S1/2 SWNW, T154, R101

Kent Jarcik City Planner presented the following;

This application is for a variance for Section 9, Sublot 1 in S1/2SWNW T154 R101. The property is located just west of 44th Avenue West and the new Williston High School. The proposal is to locate the home in the location of a previous unit that was removed last year. The variance request would be to locate a mobile home older than 15 years in the Agriculture Zoning District. The City code for siting a unit is 15 years or newer with a permit through the Building Department. The proposed unit has been substantially rebuilt from exterior to interior. The proposed home is a 1975 mobile home in the AG district. There are federal regulations of mobile homes. Units prior to 1976 were not built to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) construction and safety standards that were implemented in June 1976. Prior to 1976 they were not built to any fire, life and safety code. After June, 1976 units were considered HUD stickered manufactured homes being built to the HUD construction and safety standards. Those have been inspected and stickered by HUD. There is a state process for setting those HUD stickered homes, but only for new ones. This one in discussion is a 1975 so there is not an official route to consider this. Kent gave a brief summary of the ordinance. The unit has been substantially rehabilitated, see applicants support letter attached. As the unit was not built to the HUD standard and is prior to 1976, the Building Department and Fire Department would need to inspect the unit to decide if it is a safe structure. The development review committee (DRC) has examined the proposal. There was discussion of the rehabilitation to the original unit that has been completed. Comment was how it would be determined if improvements were up to code. Commissioners present felt the inspections needed to be completed by the State Electrical

Inspector, Fire Department and Building Department first before a decision could be made. There was support for the proposal as long as the unit passed inspections. Building, Fire and State Electrical inspections have been completed. The inspections were all approved with some minor corrections needed by the Building Department and electrical inspector. If the variance were approved the applicant would need a to obtain a placement permit from the Building Department.

Based on the DRC meeting the previous owner had completed a substantial amount of the rehabilitation to the inside and outside of the home including the wiring. The applicant's variance is tied to the rehabilitation to the home that has occurred and based on that in actuality is no longer a 1975. The application premise is a hardship would occur if the home could not be located on the property based on an original model date. In this circumstance the letter of the code substantially exists due to fire, life and safety standards. However, the code does have wording considering basic aesthetic features of modern manufactured home residential units. Considering a unit is being reviewed based on rehabilitation, compatibility within the district and neighborhood should also be considered. This district is the Agriculture zoning district within the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ) characterized by large lots and large undeveloped lots. The specific property is a large property itself 5.9 acres in size. To the west the unit would be adjacent to the property owner's own property. To the north is large undeveloped property that is currently cultivated land and zoned Agriculture. To the east is 44th Avenue and the High School football field. The setback from the home to the east property line is approximately 460 feet. Immediately to the south are properties currently undeveloped in cultivated land. From those properties the parcels immediately adjacent to the subject property are zoned R-3 multifamily and a portion currently zoned AG. There is an approximately 320-foot setback from the proposed home to its south property line. There are four other mobile/manufactured homes in the surrounding neighborhood. Two are 70's era mobile homes, one is an older single-wide but newer than a 70's model. In addition, there is a modern double wide manufactured home in the area. From a purely model date perspective, if the unit has been rebuilt so it can be determined to be compliant with fire, life and safety through inspections then it could be argued that the literal interpretation of the ordinance would deny the applicants rights enjoyed by others in the same district. The rebuilt nature of the unit would make it compatible with the surrounding area and properties in this district as long as the home is compliant with Fire, Building and State electrical inspections. Kent read a letter provided by an adjacent property owner and indicated there were some concerns from the Planning and Zoning Commission and gave a brief overview of their concerns. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommends denying this request.

Mayor Klug asked if the applicant knew of all the requirements before moving the trailer on to the property. Kent answered yes.

Commissioner Bekkedahl asked if the objection from Planning and Zoning was about the age of the trailer or if it was because it was a trailer house. Kent answered if it were 2004 or newer it would not have needed any review and would have just needed to go through the Building Department permitting process.

Commissioner Cymbaluk commented that we did bring this area into the City and Mayor Klug acknowledged this statement but reiterated that we allowed them to keep what they had until it was time to change and then they had to adhere to the new rules.

Mayor Klug opened the public hearing and asked if anyone wanted to speak on this matter to approach the podium and state their name for the record.

Cole Arndt, the property owner indicated he has updated all the electrical and made other improvements to the trailer to bring it up to code and it will be painted next spring.

Commissioner Piesik asked Mr. Arndt about doing some landscaping, he answered we would consider this.

Commissioner Bekkedahl asked Mr. Arndt if he is the original owner of this property. Mr. Arndt answered yes. Commissioner Bekkedahl asked if this is the original trailer or a newer one that has been upgraded. Mr. Arndt answered in 2014 a new trailer was moved on to the property.

Mayor Klug asked a second time, he asked a third time, hearing none, Mayor Klug closed the public hearing.

Commissioner Cymbaluk stated he realizes this is an older trailer but indicated it has been brought up to code and feels we should consider this.

Mayor Klug wanted to point out this is a part of the City that we are moving forward to re-development, an area we are concentrating on single-family homes and allowing a trailer home to move in that does not meet the standards we have set, is not something I can agree with.

David Tuan City Administrator presented the following;

As of last week, we closed a period of advertisement on a 40-acre parcel of property in Williston Square, also known as the Sloulin Field re-development area. This was done for several reasons, as we received some interest from developers in purchasing land and doing some development and as we are working through the platting process, we are not able to sell any land yet, but we are getting close to finishing the plat this winter. We wanted to assess what the level of interest was, and we received two proposals from Copeland Development and Darwin Lindahl Architects/Williston Auto. The process ahead of us is to select one of these proposals, as we are not ready to enter into a purchase agreement yet, but it is coming soon. I recommend proceeding with negotiations with Copeland Development.

Commissioner Cymbaluk asked if this ties our hands for anything along the highway. Dave Tuan answered what follows this, if approved tonight, we would be authorized, either through committee or staff or however you structure it, to discuss a purchase agreement and then details on specifics of the property.

Mayor Klug asked if we move forward with the Copeland proposal, will we be able to entertain the other proposal if there is that option. Dave answered for the format of land sales, this is the process we have identified, so far and we may come up with something a bit more flexible, but as of now, we do have to go through the advertisement and does present some challenges with timing. As far as additional land, we could visit with Mr. Billion and discuss other options.

City Attorney Jordon Evert stated the Ordinance does require public advertisement for two consecutive weeks for the sale of property and gave a further re-cap of requirements and the possibility of amending our ordinance.

Commissioner Cymbaluk asked depending on how this goes, can we go back to the proposal from Darwin Lindahl Architects, as they do not seem to need as much land. Dave answered yes that is always an option.

Mark Schneider Director of Development Services presented the following;

The El Rancho Motel is in the process of being sold. The potential buyer is in the process of doing their due-diligence and their survey noted the west edge of the motel rooms were crossing the property line by .2 feet and encroaching into 3rd Avenue West right-of-way (ROW). The buyer's agent requested a letter from Development Services as they were having a difficult time moving forward to the closing of the property, as their lender needed an agreement with the City that it was acceptable to encroach into the street ROW. The letter was delivered and later, the legal team for the buyer requested a signed encroachment agreement. City Attorney Jordon Evert has reviewed and agreed that the attached encroachment agreement is acceptable for signature. This agreement simply allows the owner the ability to keep the El Rancho in its location for the next 99 years. If there is ever a remodel of over 50% of the buildings value, or an addition, the building would have to be moved to comply with local requirements. We recommend approval of the encroachment easement as presented.

Commissioner Cymbaluk asked if we need to do something with our infrastructure, we can still gain access. Mark answered yes.

J. Airport

Anthony Dudas Airport Director presented the following:

1) XWA Wildlife Hazard Assessment

We opened our advertisement for qualifications to perform a wildlife hazard assessment at XWA on July 2, 2019. By accepting federal funds for the airport projects, we are required to perform a wildlife hazard assessment for one full year at XWA. This process will include site visits at least once per month documenting and identifying any wildlife issues. These issues might include flocking birds, large mammals like deer or coyotes, and rodents like gophers and ground squirrels. Upon completion of this assessment, we will need to update our wildlife hazard management plan to ensure we are performing everything possible to minimize and mitigate any potential wildlife hazards to aircraft activity. This update will be performed by airport staff. Midwest Wildlife Services was the only respondent. There are very few entities that perform this type of work in our region. He meets or exceeds all requirements the FAA mandates and has performed this type of work for airports all throughout our region. He has proposed a fee of \$83,864.00, which is in line with the effort for this task. We currently have approximately \$80,000 (will confirm amount at commission

meeting) allocated from the State of ND NDAC grant for this effort to be completed. The remainder will be a City cost and we recommend approval.

2) ISN Contaminated Soil Removal

The City of Williston performed a phase II environmental study to determine if contaminated soils existed, and an estimated quantity throughout the Sloulin Field site. This study included performing core samples of the contaminated area. Through this study performed by Carlson McCain, it was determined there was roughly 550 cubic yards of contaminated soils under the fuel storage location. There are additional locations under specific structures that may have some level of environmental remediation required which will be part of the building demolition project. With this information, our team solicited quotes to perform contaminated soil removal under the fuel storage area with an estimated cost of approximately \$70,000.00. We received information to perform this work from three potential contractors. J.H. Earthworx was selected through this process. This work had to be done by October 31st to meet further environmental testing requirements. If it was not completed by that time, we would have had to wait until April 1 to perform the remaining testing due to the type of contamination observed. While removing the soil, remnants of buried fuel tanks and substantially more contamination was found. The environmental study identified that approximately 5ft of soils would be removed. As they continued excavation, they needed to remove more than 20ft of soil to reach the uncontaminated area. The original estimate was less than one-day worth of work. This much larger quantity required several days. In order to meet the testing deadlines, the contractor continued this work while stockpiling materials on-site. More than 4000 tons of soil were then removed and disposed of as required in a hazardous waste landfill. I recommend approval of payment to J.H. Earthworx for pay applications 619, 620, and 621 in the amount of \$403,949.00.

Commissioner Piesik asked how soon we were informed the cost was going to be more. Anthony answered as soon as they began excavation, within 24-hours.

Commissioner Piesik asked whose idea was the stockpiling of contaminated soil. Anthony answered it was a decision made by both the contractor and our engineer, due to time constraints and a lack of truck drivers.

Commissioner Bekkedahl asked does the fulfillment of this cost and contract also bring a clean environmental certification for selling the property. Anthony answered yes.

Commissioner Bekkedahl asked if there are other sites within this property which could be contaminated. Anthony answered yes, there have been some areas identified, like maintenance facilities, that will need some environmental mitigation.

Commissioner Cymbaluk asked if there could be any potential recourse. Anthony answered no, as our lease agreements did not provide any protection in this area.

City Attorney Jordon Evert stated we can do some additional research.

Anthony indicated all these costs associated with the decommissioning of Sloulin Field that are required by the FAA are going to be deducted from the fair market value of the appraised value of the entire property.

Commissioner Bekkedahl asked as these operations changed ownership, in every one of those instances the leases pertaining to this area, never go back to the origination of the original contract. In other words, we just kept agreeing to whatever the original lease terms were. Anthony answered yes this is what happened.

Commissioner Bekkedahl asked if this was something we could not do or something that was not addressed. Anthony answered it was not addressed.

Commissioner Cymbaluk asked if this was something our City Attorney could address and Mayor Klug stated yes, we need to address and consider this.

Mayor Klug asked who the environmental study was done by. Anthony answered Carlson McCain.

Mayor Klug asked if they did it for all the sites. Anthony answered yes.

Commissioner Bekkedahl asked was there any bond in place on these tanks that could go back to any clean-up efforts. Anthony answered we are continuing to research this, but we do not have any information tonight.

Commissioner Cymbaluk asked if there was another fund, through the state health department or the state EPA. Commissioner Bekkedahl answered the original fund was through the Insurance Commissioner's office and it was moved to the Department of Environmental Quality and the fund was at its bare minimum for funds to take care of these issues. The funds are there but not sure how to access it and recommend we continue to research these options.

Mayor Klug asked when you went back and did the math and determined how much soil needed to be removed was it in line with the original bid or were there other things like time for truck drivers and things like this built into this. Anthony answered yes, the job was intended to take two days and it took five days and included substantially more labor involved as well.

Mayor Klug asked how much the bid was for two days. Anthony answered it was just over \$70,000.

Mayor Klug asked how five days turns into over \$400,000 and asked which engineers have approved this. Anthony answered Ulteig has reviewed this. Mayor Klug asked Anthony if he agrees with it and Anthony answered yes.
